How Maharishi taught 25000 people to meditate in one week in Nepal.



“Nepal to Lead the World”

In 1974, Maharishi was requested by King Birendra and the Prime Minister of Nepal to bring the essence of the Vedic Tradition contained in the practice of Transcendental Meditation to the people of Nepal. Maharishi’s theme was: “Nepal to Lead the World”. Maharishi taught 25,000 people to meditate.



Whenever thinking about Nepal, Maharishi always thought of it as a leader in the family of nations, as an example to all other nations, as the home of the preservation of the precious Vedic wisdom of life.

Over time, the new meditators from that extraordinary week rose up to become teachers of meditation and keep the spark of knowledge bright for the whole world. It is the most fitting of places for a Maharishi Tower of Invincibility.



When people arrived at the Ratna Park, Maharishi, sitting on stage, would organize them into large groups. They would be given wireless earphones over which Maharishi would initiate the groups of several hundred at a time into the practice of Transcendental Meditation.



The Nepali people were raised in the Vedic tradition. Everything was ready in their life to support the experience of enlightenment. Once the experience was given, in that first whisper from Maharishi, the whole thing was immediately complete.



Maharishi offered to demonstrate the ability of broadcast television to bring this wisdom to Nepal. Maharishi's team set up a video broadcast station at the Swayambhunath temple. The broadcast antenna was attached above the all-seeing eye in the temple's dome.



Since no one in Kathmandu had a television set or had seen television, Maharishi had jeeps equipped with electric generators, and television sets were mounted facing out the open tailgate. Loudspeakers were mounted on the roof of the jeep. These jeeps would then drive through the streets of Katmandu so that people could see the television programs as the loud speakers announced that Maharishi would be teaching meditation Ratna Park, the central park of Katmandu.
